BEFORE PARTICIPATING IN A CLINICAL TRIAL:

What is a Clinical Trial?

Clinical trials (also called clinical research) are research studies in human volunteers to answer specific health questions. Some clinical trials test new drug combinations or therapies for the treatment of disease, while others study strategies for disease prevention, diagnosis and screening. Carefully conducted clinical trials are used to find treatments that work in people and improve health.

What You Need to Know:

Before volunteering for a clinical trial, it is important to learn as much as possible about the trial and the care you can expect to receive while you are in it. You may wish to ask the questions below before making a decision about whether to enroll in a clinical trial.

- What is the purpose of the study?
- Who is going to be in the study?
- Why do researchers believe the experimental treatments being tested may be effective?
- Has it been tested before?
- What kinds of tests and experimental treatments are involved?
- How do the possible risks, side effects, and benefits in the study compare with my current treatment?
- How might this trial affect my daily life?
- How long will the trial last?
- Will hospitalization be required?
- Who will pay for the experimental treatment?
- Will I be reimbursed for other expenses?
- What type of long-term follow up care is part of this study?
- How will I know that the experimental treatment is working?
- Will results of the trial be provided to me?
- Who will be in charge of my daily care?
