

# Journey to Better Health Baltimore 2024 Survey Results



#### About the Exhibit

Journey to Better Health (JTBH) is an outreach initiative that brings educational resources about clinical research to the heart of underserved communities by way of a traveling RV. The goal of this project is to engage diverse communities in clinical research by integrating into the community and meeting folks where they are to make this information accessible. JTBH aims to raise awareness about clinical research, address underlying barriers to participation, and increase engagement of communities that have not been appropriately represented in the clinical research process. In turn, the CISCRP team can gain a better understanding of how community-based education may affect people's attitudes and perceptions towards clinical research.



#### **About the Events**

In the Fall of 2024, JTBH visited four community events in Baltimore, MD:

- Frederick Community Health Fair, October 5<sup>th</sup> About 150 exhibit visitors
- St. Matthew's G.T.A.F. Church & Community Outreach Clinic, October 9<sup>th</sup> About 100 exhibit visitors
- Salem United Methodist Church Food Distribution Day, October 11<sup>th</sup> About 50 exhibit visitors
- Our Community Market, October 12<sup>th</sup> About 50 exhibit visitors



#### **About the Impact Surveys**

Visitors to the JTBH exhibit were asked to complete two surveys: Survey #1 was administered before visitors experienced the JTBH exhibit, and Survey #2 was provided after they experienced the exhibit.

In total, there were 350 estimated visitors to the JTBH exhibit across all four events, of whom 251 completed both surveys.



#### **Key Highlights**

We received 251 complete, valid responses that were linked across Survey #1 and Survey #2



- JTBH educational exhibit highly effective in increasing levels of understanding of clinical research
  - Strong understanding of clinical research more than doubles after viewing the exhibit compared to before viewing (from 27% understanding clinical research 'Very well' before the exhibit to 60% after viewing the exhibit).



- Willingness to participate, perceptions of safety, and interest in learning more about clinical research were all positively impacted as well
  - After visiting the JTBH exhibit, respondents were more likely to indicate high willingness to participate/believe that clinical research is 'Very safe'/show strong interest in learning more



 After visiting the exhibit, people generally were likely and felt confident to take steps toward learning more about clinical research/participating



- Respondents reported a very positive experience visiting the JTBH exhibit
  - 98% had an 'Excellent' or 'Very good' experience
  - Information presented, interactions with CISCRP staff, and overall atmosphere were top aspects of the exhibit that visitors liked most





Most heard about the exhibit just by walking by, and the top reasons for visiting were that they wanted to learn more about clinical research and the exhibit looked interesting.










## The Impact

# JTBH Educational Exhibit Highly Effective in Increasing Levels of Understanding of Clinical Research


Strong understanding of clinical research more than doubles after viewing the exhibit compared to before viewing (from 27% understanding clinical research 'Very well' before the exhibit to 60% after viewing the exhibit).





#### JTBH May Increase Willingness to Participate


After visiting the JTBH mobile exhibit, respondents were more likely to indicate that they were "Very willing" to participate in clinical research (43%) compared to before viewing the exhibit (36%).





#### Exhibit May Also Impact Perceptions of Clinical Trial Safety


After visiting the JTBH mobile exhibit, respondents were more likely to indicate that they believed clinical research studies to be "Very Safe" (46%) compared to before viewing the exhibit (37%).





## Exhibit Raises Interest Levels in Learning More about Clinical Research


After visiting the JTBH mobile exhibit, the majority (60%) say they are "Very interested" in learning more about clinical research.





#### Most Visitors Likely to Take Next Steps Toward Participation

After viewing the exhibit, most would be 'Somewhat' or 'Very likely' to take the next steps in getting involved in the clinical research process. Most would talk to their family, doctor, and friends about clinical research.






# Visitors Feel Confident to Take the Next Steps Toward Participation

After visiting the JTBH mobile exhibit, the majority (56%) say they are "Very confident" they could take the next step to learn more about and/or enroll in a clinical research study.

How confident are you in taking the next step to learn more about and/or enroll in a clinical research study?





# 96% had an 'Excellent' or 'Very Good' Experience


## Overall, how would you rate your experience visiting the mobile exhibit?


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## Visitors Most Liked the Information Provided and Interactions with CISCRP Staff
