

Journey to Better Health Newark Events July 2025 Impact Survey Results



About the Exhibit

Journey to Better Health (JTBH) is an outreach initiative that brings educational resources about clinical research to the heart of underserved communities by way of a traveling RV. The goal of this project is to engage diverse communities in clinical research by integrating into the community and meeting folks where they are to make this information accessible. JTBH aims to raise awareness about clinical research, address underlying barriers to participation, and increase engagement of communities that have not been appropriately represented in the clinical research process. In turn, the CISCRP team can gain a better understanding of how community-based education may affect people's attitudes and perceptions towards clinical research.



About the Events

In the Summer of 2025, JTBH visited 6 community events in Newark, New Jersey:

About the Impact Surveys

Visitors to the JTBH exhibit were asked to complete two surveys: Survey #1 was administered before visitors experienced the JTBH exhibit, and Survey #2 was provided after they experienced the exhibit.

In total, 268 exhibit visitors completed both surveys during community events. 25 visitors completed both surveys during the Bristol Myers Squibb™ Disability Pr

25 visitors completed both surveys during the Bristol Myers Squibb™ Disability Pride Month Event (primarily a professional audience for this event, i.e., BMS employees).



Key Highlights

We received 268 complete, valid responses that were linked across Survey #1 and Survey #2



- · JTBH educational exhibit highly effective in increasing levels of understanding of clinical research
 - Strong understanding of clinical research increases after viewing the exhibit compared to before viewing (from 39% understanding clinical research 'Very well' before the exhibit to 57% after viewing the exhibit).



- Willingness to participate, perceptions of safety, and interest in learning more about clinical research were all positively impacted as well
 - After visiting the JTBH exhibit, respondents were more likely to indicate willingness to participate/believe that clinical research is 'Very safe'/show strong interest in learning more



- After visiting the exhibit, people generally were likely and felt confident to take steps toward learning more about clinical research/participating
- Respondents reported a very positive experience visiting the JTBH exhibit
 - 90% had an 'Excellent' or 'Very good' experience
 - Information presented and interactions with CISCRP staff were top aspects of the exhibit that visitors liked most

We received 268 complete, valid responses to Surveys #1 and #2.

30 visitors completed the surveys in Spanish and one person completed the surveys in Portuguese, with the remainder of visitors completing the surveys in English.

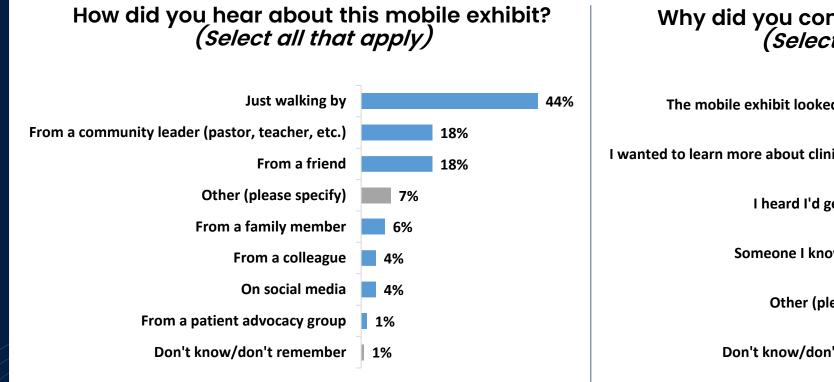
25 BMS professionals additionally took both surveys during the BMS Disability Pride Month Event.

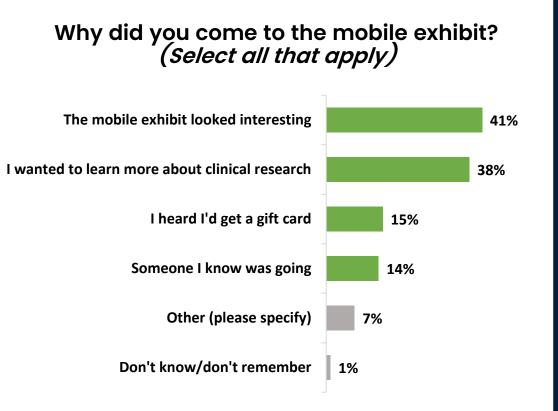

Most heard about the exhibit just by walking by, and the top reasons for visiting were that the exhibit looked interesting and they wanted to learn more about clinical research.





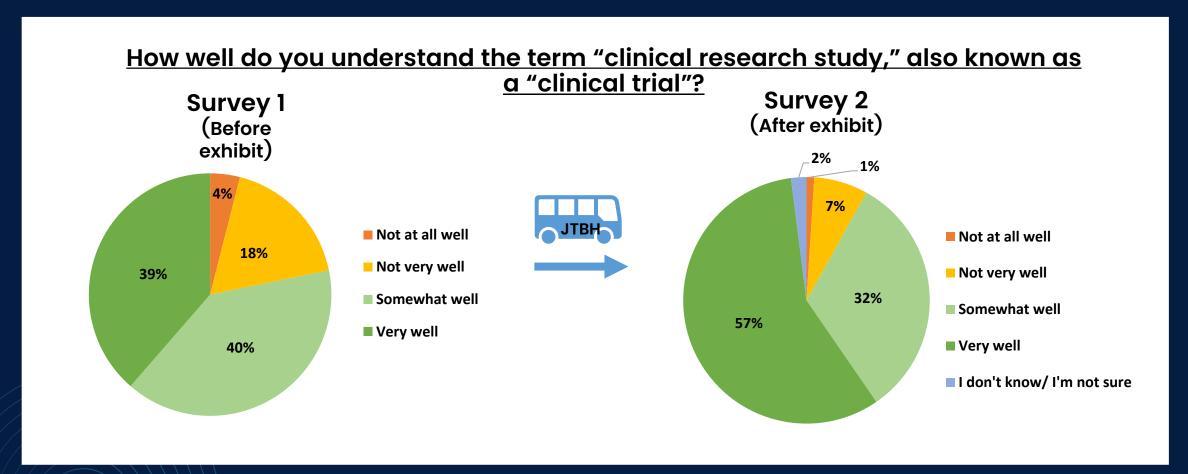




The Impact

JTBH Educational Exhibit Highly Effective in Increasing Levels of Understanding of Clinical Research

Strong understanding of clinical research increases after viewing the exhibit compared to before viewing (from 39% understanding clinical research 'Very well' before the exhibit to 57% after viewing the exhibit).





JTBH May Increase Willingness to Participate

After visiting the JTBH mobile exhibit, respondents were more likely to indicate that they were 'Somewhat/Very Willing' to participate in clinical research (76%) compared to before viewing the exhibit (81%).

In general, how willing would you be to participate in a clinical research study?

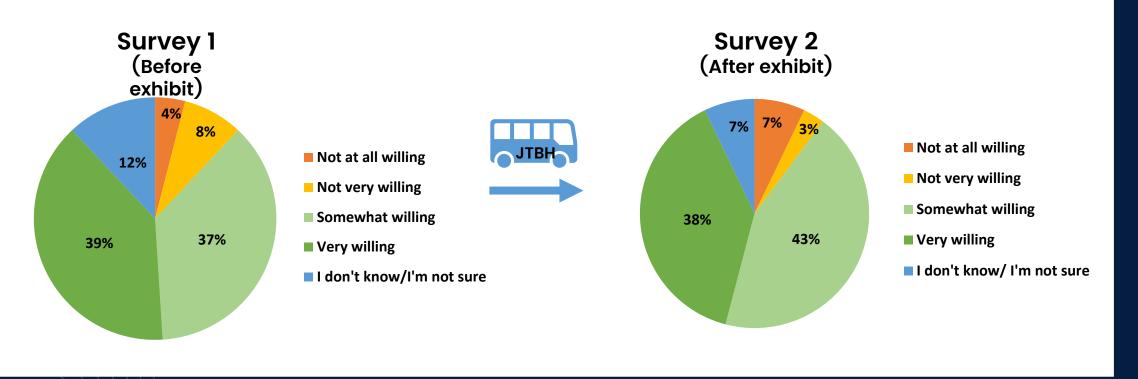




Exhibit May Also Impact Perceptions of Clinical Trial Safety

After visiting the JTBH mobile exhibit, respondents were more likely to indicate that they believed clinical research studies to be 'Somewhat/Very Safe' (83%) compared to before viewing the exhibit (73%).

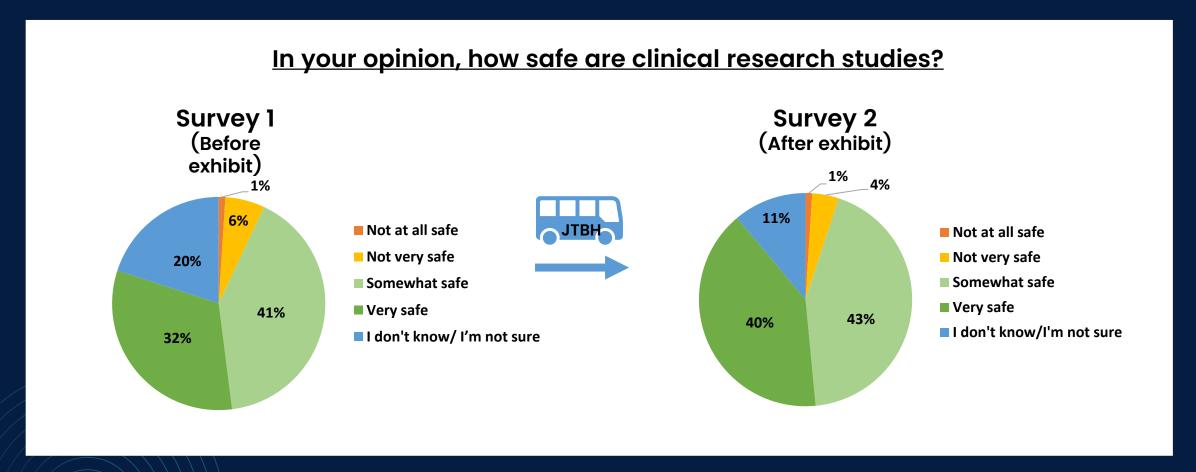
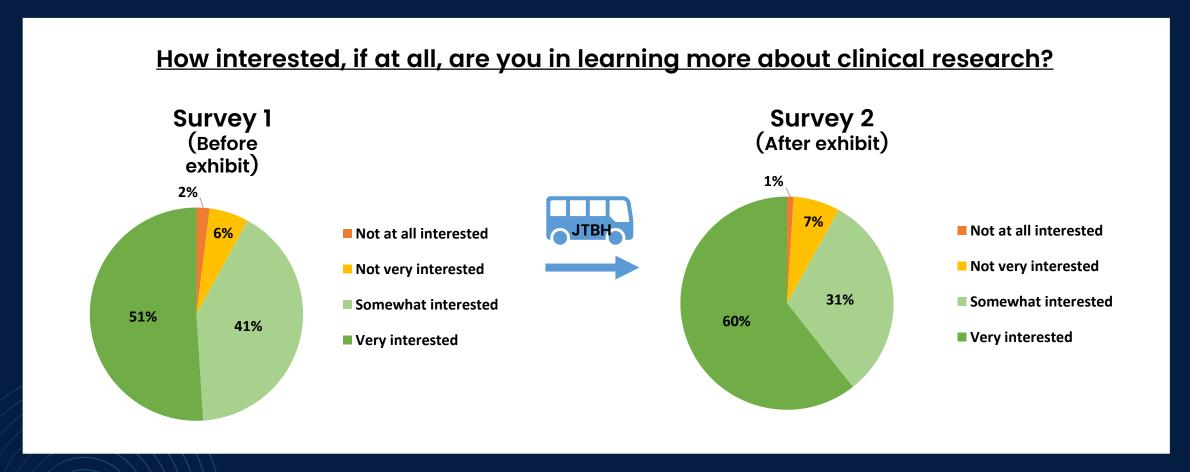




Exhibit Raises Interest Levels in Learning More about Clinical Research

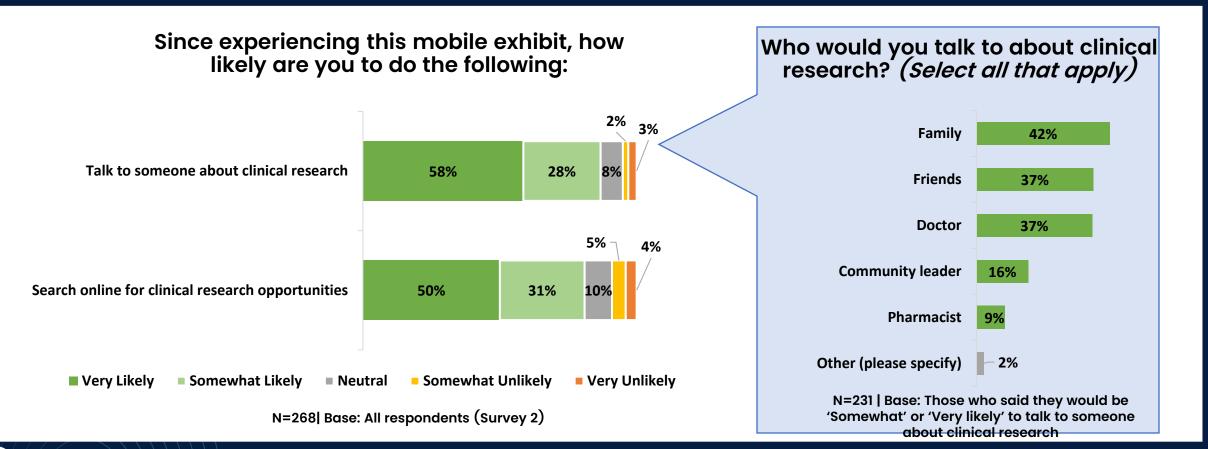
After visiting the JTBH mobile exhibit, respondents were more likely to indicate strong interest in learning more about clinical research studies (60%) compared to before viewing the exhibit (51%).





Most Visitors Likely to Take Next Steps Toward Participation

After viewing the exhibit, most would be 'Somewhat' or 'Very likely' to take the next steps in getting involved in the clinical research process. Most would talk to their family, friends, and doctor about clinical research.

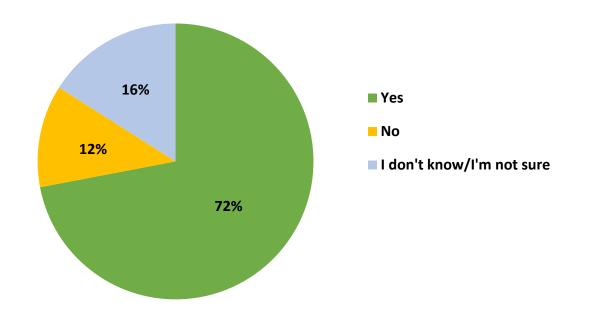




Majority of Visitors Feel Confident to Take the Next Steps Toward Participation

After visiting the JTBH mobile exhibit, the majority (83%) say they would know who to talk to/where to go for information to learn more or enroll in a trial.

Since experiencing this mobile exhibit, would you know who to talk to/where to go for information if you wanted to learn more or enroll in a trial?



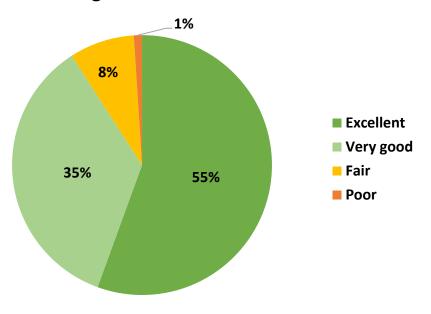

90% had an 'Excellent' or 'Very Good' Experience

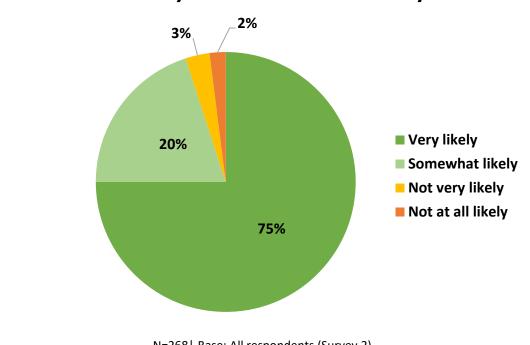
Overall, how would you rate your experience visiting the mobile exhibit?

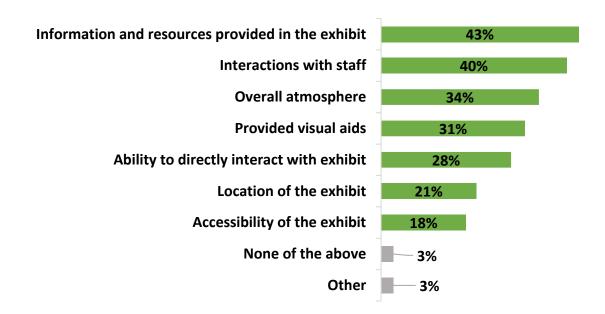

57% selected 'None of the above'



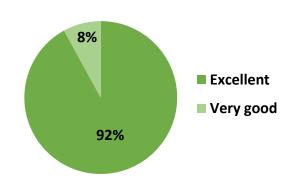


100% of BMS Event Attendees Reported Positive Experiences Visiting the Exhibit

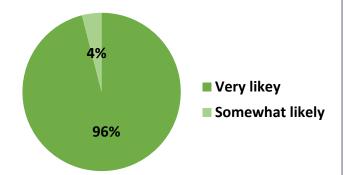
In addition to the 268 respondents from Newark community events, 25 attendees completed both surveys during the BMS Disability Pride Month Event (this event had mostly a professional audience).
